As we celebrate together as a community today, we are reminded of the words of Pope Benedict XVI, who said that Corpus Christi processions enable us to "immerse Christ, so to speak, in the daily routine of our lives, so that he may walk where we walk and live where we live."

The Blessing of the Eucharist from a Homily of Pope Francis

Why is it good to bless? Because it turns a word into a gift. When we bless, we are not doing something for ourselves, but for others. Blessing is not about saying nice words or trite phrases. No, it is about speaking goodness, speaking with love.

That is what Melchizedek did, when he spontaneously blessed Abram, who had not said or done anything for him. Jesus did the same thing, and he showed what the blessing meant by freely distributing the loaves.

How many times too, have we been blessed, in church or in our homes? How many times have we received words of encouragement, or a sign of the cross on our forehead? We were blessed on the day of our baptism, and we are blessed at the end of every Mass.

The Eucharist is itself a school of blessing. God blesses us, his beloved children, and thus encourages us to keep going. And we, in turn, bless God in our assemblies (cf. Ps 68:26), rediscovering the joy of praise that liberates and heals the heart.

We come to Mass, certain that we will be blessed by the Lord, and we leave in order to bless others in turn, to be channels of goodness in the world.



Father Austin McCormack OFM

I first met Father Austin when in 1958 I went to St Bernadine's College Buckingham for my Secondary School. Austin taught PE, games and History and Latin to the younger boys.

The school was small (120 boys) so Austin had to double up as groundsman and he would whizz around the playing fields on a tractor with a gang-mower in tow. For such a gentle man you might be surprised at a game he supervised in which a medicine ball which was placed in the middle of the gym had to be moved to the end wall. Two teams contested with no holds barred and in my experience no-one ever succeeded. We played football and cricket against much bigger schools and did very well and that was down to Austin's training.

When Buckingham closed, he came here and was involved as Director in the Samaritans in Ilford. His caring nature and ability to listen carefully were assets in such work. Sometime after leaving Buckingham, he went on a course in Spirituality in Rome and that equipped him to give retreats. He did many retreats mainly to religious and priests but he also gave many talks in this parish. Many of the friars used him as a spiritual director and in his time in Canterbury he taught courses in Spirituality. He was the Provincial Minister of our Province for nine years and the friars found him very approachable. His habit was to go to bed early but to be at his desk from 4 a.m. because he found he could work in the early morning.

We miss him in community as a genial companion and we pray that he will find genial company with Our Lord.
