Streamed Masses

For many weeks Paul has struggled with makeshift equipment to stream our mass each Sunday into your homes. You have experienced the difficulty over the past three weeks. He is not available today but thankfully Mike Eggleton has agreed to come to our aid. He will record the Sunday mass which we will celebrate on Saturday, and, we hope, put it on your screens at the due time on Sunday morning.

Mass with real people

What a joy it has been to celebrate mass once more with you in person. You have said the same. It is only a week and a half since we resumed mass with you. At first the congregation was small. Wisely you were cautious. That is why we continue with only the streamed mass on each Sunday. We are aware that more than 120 sets have logged on to our transmission on each Sunday. If several people or families are watching the number of individuals increases. - The evening masses during the week have proved less popular than the mornings at 10 am. Please tell us what you think. For the moment we will continue the current practice: Mass at 10am on Wednesday and Saturday; at 7 pm on Monday and Friday. We will change it if you can suggest better.

Baptism and Holy Communion

The gueues are long! Matthew is offering a range of opportunities to the families anxious to baptise their newlyborn. Soon the water will be flowing. mainly on a Sunday afternoon. More than 100 children are waiting to receive Jesus for the first time. The masses at which this will happen will have to be very different from those we have known in previous years. What matters is that they can receive Jesus. We are working out the possibilities and hope to provide many masses during August each accommodating a small number of families. Parents and the parish office are busily engaged, as are the catechists and we friars.
