

Holy week

How have you done with prayer fasting and good works in the past 5 weeks? Not as good as you intended? Never mind! Concentrate now on accompanying Jesus through the last days of his life on earth. The services are reduced because of covid restrictions: the reality is the same. Join us at 8pm on Thursday and then keep vigil with Jesus in his agony. On Friday at 3 pm the usual service will comprise hearing the passion of St John, prayer for the universal church and communion. We cannot kiss the cross, but the rest is the same. There will be Stations of the Cross, for children at 10 am and again in the evening at 8pm. Both of these are on stream only - no congregation in church. Saturday is empty till 9 pm. I hope a full, albeit distanced, community will celebrate the returning light shattering darkness, bringing hope out of what looked like total disaster. The vigil will be shorter in form but I hope to introduce some of the drama to which we are accustomed. And mass at 9 and 11 am brings full Easter joy.
