We celebrate the birth of Jesus in the middle of the night to acknowledge the other darkness in which we have to live. Only when we understand what darkness really is, can we appreciate the wonder and the beauty of the light that lit up the world when Jesus was born. Hope at last—a new start, a new beginning.

There was a moment in your life when your world actually stopped, and turned its attention to you, and people who loved you prayed for you and asked that you too could be like him, a light in the darkness. And someone held a lighted candle for you. Christmas is the time when, once again, you can own what that candle meant. A lighted candle has a lot to say to us: all the darkness in the world is so passive that it cannot even extinguish that tiny light.

No one seemed to notice when Christ was born; it remained silent—and then, as if to get things moving, an angel appears to shepherds sleeping in the next field. It was as if God looked around the world he had made and did not recognise it any more—it certainly did not recognise him. He could not be born into structures which make compromises with the ways of darkness: so he was born in an empty field: an empty place in which to make a new beginning.

His Mother tells you not to be afraid of the emptiness. She gave thanks that her own emptiness was blessed. She was filled so full that on this night she was able to present the world with its Saviour. A vocation as much ours as hers; we too can present our world with its Saviour by the very way we live in it, if we too allow our emptiness to be assured, allow the Spirit to fill us so full of this new way of being human: a way which insists on feeding hungry people, giving warmth and shelter to people who are cold and exposed, comforting lonely people, reassuring frightened people and becoming a tiny flickering flame of hope for those who have nothing but fear of the dark.
